

## BIBLE STUDY #1

### SALVATION

John 3:3,7 - In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, unless a man is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.... You should not be surprised at my saying 'You must be born again.' "

Our Lord Jesus Christ commanded us saying, "You must be born again." In this lesson you should learn:

- A. Why we need to be saved.
- B. What God has done for our salvation.
- C. How we can have that salvation personally.

Each time you start your Bible Study, **PRAY** (talk to God). Ask God's Holy Spirit to open your heart to take in and understand His Word and to show you how to use it in your life. Do not copy the scriptures (the verses from the Bible), but answer the questions with short answers and in your own words.

**SIN** is the failure to obey any of God's commandments or laws.

One of the most important habits to get into that will help you grow as a new Christian is memorizing Bible verses. In Psalm 119:11 the Bible says, "*I have hidden Your Word in my heart, that I might not sin against You.*"

Memorizing Bible verses and doing what they say will help you fight against temptation (being tempted to do wrong) and show you how to do what is right. We encourage you to memorize the verse below to give you a better understanding of *what it is to be saved.*

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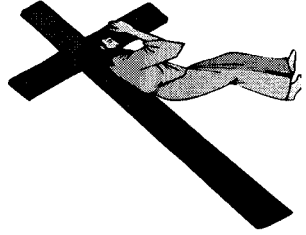

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**JUSTICE** is getting what we deserve. If God were only a *just* God, we would all die.

**MERCY** is not getting what we deserve. It is by His *mercy* He can forgive us.

**GRACE** is getting something we don't deserve at all. By God's *grace* (not of our own doings) He sent us His Son.

**FAITH** is "believing as truth," the things which cannot be shown by our own senses (seeing, tasting, hearing, touching, or smelling). *Faith* is trusting God.

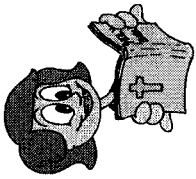
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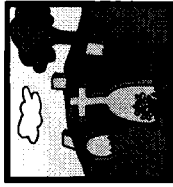


## BIBLE STUDY #2

### FAITH and ASSURANCE

1 John (one book of three (3) books in the New Testament of the Bible. This could be written with a I,II,III in front of the word John.), chapter 5, verse 12.



1 John 5:12

*"He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life."*

*Hebrews 6:18-19 - He has given us both His promise and His oath, two things we can completely count on, for it is impossible for God to tell a lie. Now all those who flee to Him to save them can take new courage when they hear such assurances from God; now they can know without doubt that He will give them the salvation He has promised them. This certain hope of*

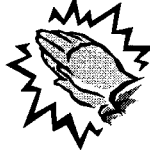
*being saved is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls, connecting us with God Himself behind the sacred curtains of heaven. (The Living Bible paraphrased.)*

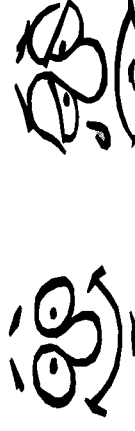

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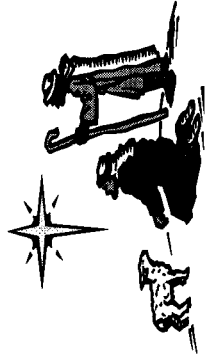

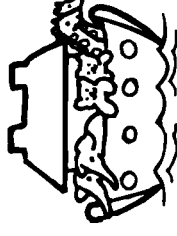

## BIBLE STUDY #3

### POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The memory verse for this study is Acts 1:8 (the *Living Bible* version)



Acts 1:8

*"But when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, you will receive power to bear witness about me with great results..."*

Acts 1:4-5 ---- *On one occasion while He was eating with them, He gave this command. "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."*

Jesus did not want His disciples to go right away to begin telling others about Him. He told them to wait for the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, because He knew the **POWER** they were to get was very important for the work ahead of them.

In this lesson you should learn:

- A. Who the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is for.
- B. What the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is for.
- C. How to receive the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

**BAPTISM** - means to be fully put into or dipped into something.

So that you will not become unsure of what you are reading in God's Word, you need to know that there are many different words which point to "The Baptism of the Holy Spirit," and they *all* mean the same thing:

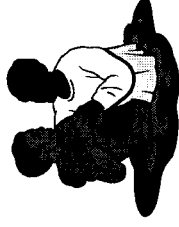
- Acts 2:4 - "Filled with the Holy Spirit"
- Acts 2:33 - "The promise of the Holy Spirit"
- Acts 2:38 - "The gift of the Holy Spirit"
- Acts 11:15 - "Holy Spirit fell (came) on them"
- Luke 24:29 - "The promise of my Father."

In John 14:16+17 Jesus told His disciples that the Holy Spirit had been **WITH** them and would soon be **IN** them. The Holy Spirit came inside them in John 20:22. (Stop and read John 20:22 now.) After Jesus had been resurrected (He arose after His death on the cross for our sins), He spoke to them and said, "*Receive the Holy Spirit.*" Before we are saved, the Holy Spirit is **WITH** us calling us to Jesus. When we are "born again", the Holy Spirit come **INSIDE** us to teach and guide us. All true believers have the Holy Spirit living inside them. But, Jesus went on to tell His disciples in Acts 1:8 that the Holy Spirit would also be **ON** or **UPON** them.

When the books of the Bible were first written, they were written in Greek or Hebrew languages. The Greek language is from the people of Greece and the Hebrew language is from the Jewish people of Israel. Then a King from England had the words translated (or changed ) into English words, so that we could read and understand Gods' Words, too !!!

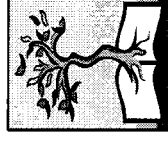


The Greek word for **POWER** is "dunamis," where we get our words "dynamite" and "dynamic." It is also means strength, ability, authority, and might.

Jesus knows our weaknesses and that we do not have the strength we need to "keep on" following Him or to do things for Him, so He gives us the **POWER** (dunamis) we need. *We do not have to do it all on our own!!*

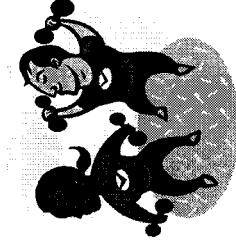

Another good thing that is of "the Baptism of the Holy Spirit" is that the Holy Spirit wants to give each of us "spiritual gifts" or supernatural (God gives it to us-we can't do it on our own.) "know-how" to **EDIFY** (build up faith or strengthen) ourselves and other believers. The Bible calls believers "the body of Christ." Jesus is the head of the body (or church) and each of us is given a gift or gifts. That gift or gifts help us with our special jobs as a part of that body.

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The Holy Spirit is like an electric wall outlet in your house. The power is always there, all you have to do is plug into it. In Ephesians 5:18, the Bible tells us to "be filled with the Holy Spirit." It is better said, "always be filled with the Holy Spirit." This is talking about REFILLS. It is not a ONE TIME filling, but we are always in need of God's power. We get refills in the same way we get the first filling, ASK !!



If you have not already been filled with the Holy Spirit or if you need a refill, just pray a simple prayer like this:

"Father God, my power is not enough. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and give me the power I need. In Jesus' name, AMEN."

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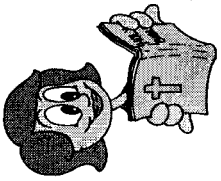

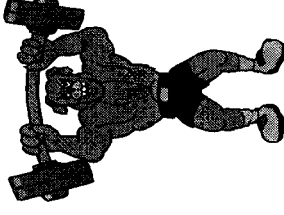
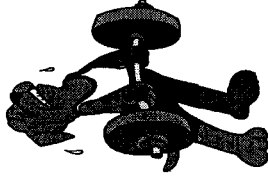
## BIBLE STUDY #4

### TRIALS

In this lesson you should learn:

- A. What trials are.
- B. How God uses trials in our life.
- C. What we should do when we are in the middle of a trial.

A **TRIAL** is when God allows temptations, tribulations, (hard-times, trouble or pain) or our relationship with other people to **TEST OUR FAITH**. It is the way He uses to refine (to make our faith stronger) us and teach us to trust Him more.



The memory verse for this study is 1 Corinthians 10:13  
(*New King James Version*):

1 Corinthians 10:13

*"No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, [who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.]*

1 Peter 4:12-13 - *Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful trail you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when His glory is revealed.*

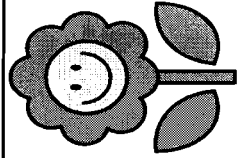
Soon after we are born again the Lord begins to **TEST** our faith. He often removes the emotions and feelings we have been experiencing (since you asked Jesus into your heart and life) to cause us to walk **BY FAITH**. This does not mean He has left you!

**PATIENCE** or **PERSEVERANCE** means holding strong and staying with Jesus during the "hard-times" that happen in our lives, and still do this with joy in our hearts.



One way to look at our trials, is staying strong in Jesus during the hard-times and troubles. When the Lord is working with us as His children, He will allow tribulations to correct (chasten) or discipline us.

**CHASTEN** or **DISCIPLINE** in the Greek language means to train, educate, instruct, correct, reprove (to express disapproval), or admonish (warn gently). It is a positive, loving way of removing evil and encouraging good. It is **NOT** unkind punishment.

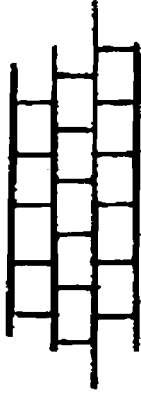

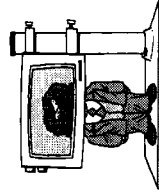

Another way God tests our faith is by allowing Satan to tempt us. Each time the Lord helps us to stand against another temptation, we learn to trust Him more. He uses it as building blocks for our faith in Him.



**TEMPTATION** is when Satan tries to get us to sin. Satan, a spiritual being, is a fallen angel. He is fallen because he wanted to be God. When he tried to be God, he was kicked out of heaven. He was and *is still totally against God* the Father. He has many names in the bible such as: Lucifer; the serpent (in the Garden of Eden); the father of Lies; and the deceiver. Satan was the serpent in the Garden of Eden who helped Eve to have the 1<sup>st</sup> sin. He may tempt us by putting evil thoughts in our minds. He may tempt our flesh (body), or our pride. He has many temptations. It is **NOT** a sin to be tempted!! It is only a sin *when* we give in to the temptation.

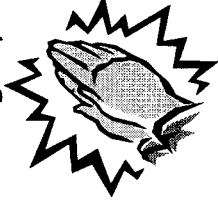

*Jesus told us in John 14:27 that the peace He gives us is not like the peace the rest of the world has. His peace does not depend on good surrounding conditions. His peace comes from knowing, that in spite of how things appear, **GOD IS STILL IN CONTROL** and we can trust Him to see us through the rough times. The hard-times we suffer are not a surprise to Him. They are part of His plan for us. By them, He prepares us, not for a temporary life of comfort, but for an eternity of holiness.*

*"Lord help me to learn from this, help me to become what you want me to be, help me to trust you through everything. In Jesus' precious name, Amen."*

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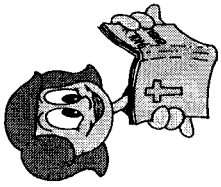
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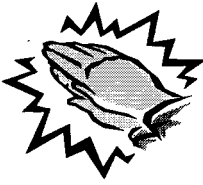

*"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petitions, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."*

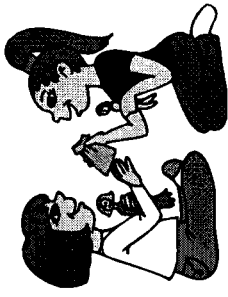
Anxious - uneasy

- C. The different types of prayer.

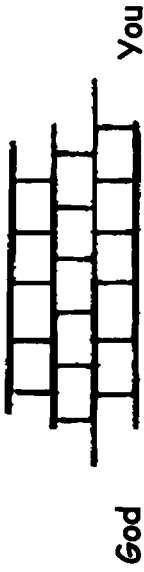

A good example of being persistent in the Bible is found in Luke 18:1-8, read it now.



*Sometimes God answers prayer with "WAIT"! If we believe our prayers are in agreement with God's will and He doesn't answer with a definite "yes" or "no", we should be patient (showing quiet uncomplaining; putting up with worry or bothering times in our lives) and wait for His answer. Keep asking! The Lord not only has the perfect answer, He has the perfect time to give His answer.*

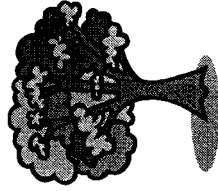
*To ask "in the name of Jesus" means to come to the Father based on the righteousness (morally right) and finished work of Jesus, not our own righteousness or merits.*

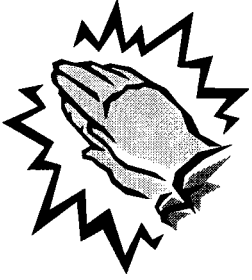

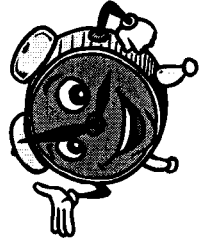


**A. SUPPLICATION, PETITION, OR REQUEST, is**

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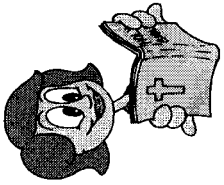

## BIBLE STUDY #6

### WHO IS JESUS ?

The memory verse for this study is Philippians 2:10-11.

Philippians 2:10-11

*"That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."*
